



## Office of the Inspector General (OIG)

### Mission:

The mission of the OIG is to investigate allegations of fraud, waste, abuse, and misconduct by the Department of Justice (Department or DOJ) employees, contractors, and grantees, and to promote economy and efficiency in Department operations. The OIG is an independent entity within the Department that reports to both the Attorney General and the Congress on issues that affect the Department's personnel or operations.

### Organization:

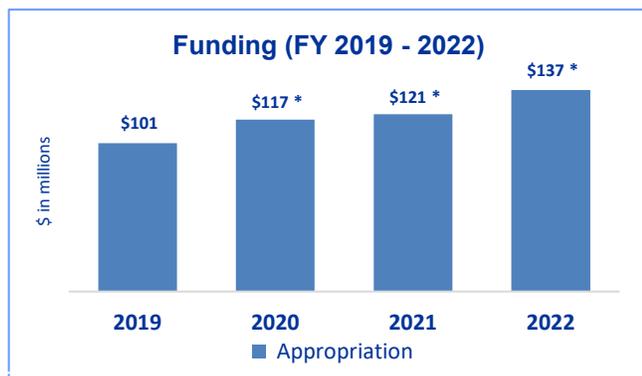
The OIG consists of the Inspector General, the Deputy Inspector General, the Office of the General Counsel, and six divisions, each headed by an Assistant Inspector General. The six OIG divisions are: the Audit Division, the Investigations Division, the Evaluation and Inspections Division, the Oversight and Review Division, the Management and Planning Division, and the Information Technology Division. The OIG operates Audit and Investigations field offices in 15 cities throughout the Nation.

### Resources:

The FY 2022 budget request for the OIG totals \$137.2 million, which is a 13.8 percent increase over the FY 2021 Enacted.

### Personnel:

The OIG's direct authorized positions for FY 2022 total 539 positions, including an increase of 48 positions over the FY 2021 Enacted of 491 direct authorized positions.

## **FY 2022 Strategy:**

The OIG is committed to assuring the Attorney General, the Congress, and taxpayers that the substantial funding provided to support the Department and its infrastructure investments are used efficiently, effectively, and for their intended purposes.

The OIG has jurisdiction over all complaints of misconduct against Department employees in the Federal Bureau of Investigation; the Drug Enforcement Administration; the Federal Bureau of Prisons; the U.S. Marshals Service; the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives; and other Offices, Boards and Divisions.

In FY 2022, the OIG will continue to investigate alleged violations of criminal and civil law, regulations, and ethical standards arising from the conduct of Department employees in their numerous and diverse activities. The OIG will also audit and inspect Department programs and assist management in promoting integrity, economy, efficiency, and efficacy. The OIG also plans to fully meet its responsibilities to oversee the Department's critical counterterrorism, information technology, cybercrime, detention, incarceration, law enforcement, and grant-related activities.

## **FY 2022 Program Changes:**

### **Physical Infrastructure:** \$3.0 million and 0 positions

The COVID-19 pandemic caused the OIG to reevaluate how it organizes and depends upon its physical offices and facilities to fulfill its mission. While the pandemic required immediate action to ensure the safety of the OIG employees, the need for impactful oversight of the DOJ national security programs did not slow. Given the OIG's limited options for accessing and storing highly sensitive classified information, the OIG is requesting \$3.0 million for constructing and maintaining Sensitive Compartmented Information Facilities in several OIG field locations to ensure the OIG continues providing high quality oversight of the DOJ's national security programs and operations. The current services for this initiative are \$400,000.

### **ITD Enhancement:** \$2.9 million and 0 positions

The requested enhancement will support the OIG's ongoing effort to create an IT infrastructure that is agile enough to respond to unforeseen events, like the COVID-19 pandemic, and durable enough to withstand the gradually increasing demand due to the evolving complexity and volume of the OIG oversight work. Funding will be used to increase cloud computing capabilities to reduce data centers, provide redundancy in the cloud operating environment, safeguard the OIG data, and ensure continuity of operations. The current services for this initiative are \$11.6 million and 29 positions.
