## MEMORANDUM

TO: HEADS OF DEPARTMENT COMPONENTS

FROM: THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

SUBJECT: Religious Liberty Task Force

Freedom of religion has been a core American principle from the very beginning of our country—indeed, it is our "first freedom." President Trump promised that he would make preserving and protecting our religious liberty the first priority of his administration. The Department of Justice is committed to assisting with that effort.

On October 6, 2017, I issued a Memorandum to All Executive Departments and Agencies on Federal Law Protections for Religious Liberty (the "Religious Liberty Memorandum"). This Religious Liberty Memorandum, which the President directed me to issue in Executive Order 13798, explained twenty key principles of religious liberty in U.S. law, and provided direction to agencies in four areas: agencies as employers, rulemaking, enforcement actions, and contracting or grant-making.

The same day, I also issued a memorandum within the Department of Justice instructing components on how to implement the Religious Liberty Memorandum (the "implementation memorandum"). This implementation memorandum called on components to incorporate the Religious Liberty Memorandum in all aspects of the Department's litigation, in advice to other agencies, in Department operations, and through its own rulemaking and its interagency rule review. The implementation memorandum required components to notify the Associate Attorney General of all issues that arise which implicate the Religious Liberty Memorandum. It assigned to the Office of Legal Policy the responsibility to review every Department rulemaking or other agency action submitted for Department review by the Office of Management and Budget to ensure its consistency with the Religious Liberty Memorandum, and it designated the Office of Legal Policy as the point of contact for any questions about either document.

Since the issuance of the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum

the Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy have together coordinated the Department's compliance with both memoranda. The Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy also have worked collaboratively with staff from several other components, drawing on their expertise in this area to ensure compliance with the memoranda and to identify additional opportunities to protect and promote religious liberty.

In order to institutionalize this process, and to leverage the expertise and experience of diverse components within the Department to identify new opportunities for the Department to engage with the issue of religious liberty, today I have established a Religious Liberty Task Force (the Task Force). I will serve as Chair of the Task Force, with the Associate Attorney General serving as Vice Chair for Litigation and the Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Policy serving as Vice Chair for Policy. The Task Force will be further composed of representatives from the Office of the Deputy Attorney General, the Civil Division, the Civil Rights Division, the Environment and Natural Resources Division, the Office of Legal Counsel, the Office of Legal Policy, the Office of Public Affairs, a U.S. Attorney's Office that I will designate, and other components that I may designate from time to aid in the Task Force's work.

The Religious Liberty Task Force will continue the Department's ongoing work to implement the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum. The Task Force will also consider new initiatives that will further the Department's work to protect and promote religious liberty. To that end, the Task Force will: 1) facilitate Department component compliance with the memoranda; 2) address novel, recurring, or cross-cutting issues in the Department's work implicating the memoranda; 3) facilitate interagency coordination regarding the Religious Liberty Memorandum; 4) engage in outreach to the public, religious communities, and religious liberty organizations to obtain feedback on compliance with the Religious Liberty Memorandum; and 5) develop new strategies, involving litigation, policy, and legislation, to protect and promote religious liberty.



# Remarks as prepared for delivery

Thank you all for being here.

On behalf of the President of the United States, Donald Trump, I want to thank all of you for your work for and commitment to religious freedom at such a time as this.

As President Trump said to the National Prayer Breakfast last year, "freedom of religion is a sacred right, but it is also...under threat all around us...I've never seen it so openly [threatened]."

This is a problem around the world.

In the Middle East, some religious minorities like the Yazidis and Christians, after centuries of coexistence with religious majorities, are facing the possibility of extinction.

In Russia, it is illegal to be a Jehovah's Witness or to publish their translation of the Bible.

In the Philippines, three Catholic priests have been assassinated so far this year. In June, a priest was shot to death at the altar right in front of the congregation.

According to Pew Research, 82 countries have "high" or "very high" restrictions on religion.

These facts reflect a rise in religious persecution in areas of the world where religious groups have been able to live peacefully together.

To avoid such results, our Founders made a commitment to religious freedom that was truly historic—and it remains exceptional today.

The Founders understood the evil of religious persecution and violence. They intended this country to be a safe haven where law-abiding people could live quietly, justly, and devoutly.

The clearest expression of this idea perhaps came from James Madison and shaped the American consensus.

Americans moved from the Locke view of tolerating people's religious views to respecting and acknowledging one's right to freely exercise their religious faith.

As Madison expressed it: "Religion; or the duty one owes to our Creator," cannot be directed by government power, and that duty "... is precedent in order of time and degree of obligation to the claims of civil society." He declared that right, "Unalienable."

The final product—the First Amendment—actually gives religious expression a double protection in the supreme law of the land. Not only do we possess freedom to exercise our beliefs but we also enjoy the freedom of speech.

Twenty years later, in 1812, former President John Adams remarked that "nothing is more dreaded than the National Government meddling with Religion." Adams and Jefferson were political opponents—but they agreed on the human right of religious freedom. But that consensus seems to be eroding. We've seen nuns ordered to pay for contraceptives. We've seen U.S. Senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about their dogma—a clear reference to their religious beliefs—even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office.

Here in Georgia, there was a religious liberty bill proposed in the legislature.

Those moral enforcers, Bob and Harvey Weinstein, were so offended that they threatened to stop filming their movies here. The people of Georgia don't measure up to the Weinstein standard.

And, of course, we've seen the ordeal faced bravely by Jack Phillips. He simply refused to yield his beliefs. And perhaps most tragically, I hear that his ordeal is far from over. But that's why ADF and other groups are right to give serious thought to and to take action on these matters.

The people of this nation are still the most religious nation in the developed world.

Yet people of faith are facing a new hostility. Really, a bigoted ideology which is founded on animus towards people of faith.

You'll notice that they don't rely on the facts. They don't make better arguments.

They don't propose higher ideals.

No, they just call people names-like "hate group."

#### Does that sound familiar?

You know I'm from Alabama—the home of the Southern Poverty Law Center, an organization that did important work in the South, vital work at a pivotal time. As you know well, the law is only words on paper until there are people brave enough to stand up for their rights.

There were hate groups in the South I grew up in. They attacked the life, liberty, and the very worth of minority citizens. You may not know this, but I helped prosecute and secure the death penalty for a klansman who murdered a black teenager in my state. The resulting wrongful death suit led to a \$7 million verdict and the bankruptcy of the Klu Klux Klan in the South. That case was brought by the Southern Poverty Law Center.

But when I spoke to ADF last year, I learned that the Southern Poverty Law Center had classified ADF as a "hate group." Many in the media simply parroted it as fact. Amazon relied solely on the SPLC designation and removed ADF from its Smile program, which allows customers to donate to charities.

They have used this designation as a weapon and they have wielded it against conservative organizations that refuse to accept their orthodoxy and choose instead to speak their conscience. They use it to bully and intimidate groups like yours which fight for the religious freedom, the civil rights, and the constitutional rights of others.

You and I may not agree on everything—but I wanted to come back here tonight partly because I wanted to say this: you are not a hate group.

You have a 9-0 record at the Supreme Court over the past seven years—and that

includes two of the most important cases of the last term. Two of those nine cases were 7-2, one was per curiam, and one was 9-0. In the lower courts, you've won hundreds of free speech cases.

That's an impressive record. These are not fringe beliefs that you're defending.

You endeavor to affirm the Constitution and American values.

As for me, I am not going to apologize for the United States of America or our First Amendment. I am not ashamed of this country or our people. This is the greatest, most generous country in the history of the world.

Let me say this loud and clear: at the Department of Justice, we will not partner with hate groups. Not on my watch.

I have ordered a review at the Department of Justice to make sure that we do not partner with any groups that discriminate. We will not partner with groups that unfairly defame Americans for standing up for the Constitution or their faith.

The American people care about this issue. Many people are deeply concerned about it.

Americans from a wide variety of faiths are asking themselves, how much longer until I am in Jack Phillips' position? How much longer until the state, the media, the academy, the tech companies, or the global corporations come down on me because of my beliefs?

Fortunately, President Donald Trump has heard these concerns. Unlike some, he is not afraid of the name-calling and the fake news. He has endured relentless media attacks in order to speak up for the forgotten people of this country. He made a promise—and from day one of this administration he has delivered. He is defending religious freedom at home and abroad.

Just last week, the Treasury Department sanctioned Turkey's Minister of Justice and Minister of the Interior, both of whom played leading roles in the arrest of American pastor Andrew Brunson.

Turkey was kind enough to return the favor—and sanction me. Yes, I was informed that they have frozen all of my Turkish assets.

President Trump has appointed 24 circuit court judges, more than any other president at this point in his presidency. One out of every seven circuit court judges is a Trump judge.

These are judges who will honor their oath to serve under the Constitution and laws of the United States. They are not above them.

Shortly after he took office, President Trump directed me to issue legal guidance to ensure that all executive agencies would faithfully apply the religious liberty protections in federal law.

Our team embraced that challenge. I spoke about it at the ADF conference in Dana Point last July.

I issued that guidance in October, and it lays out 20 fundamental principles for the Executive Branch to follow. Under this guidance, the federal government is not just reacting—we are actively seeking, carefully, thoughtfully and lawfully, to accommodate people of faith.

And under President Donald Trump, this Department of Justice is going to court across America to defend the rights of people of faith.

We are aggressively enforcing our civil rights laws, our hate crimes laws, and laws protecting churches and faith groups.

Since January 2017, we have obtained 11 indictments and eight convictions in cases involving arson or other attacks or threats against houses of worship. Our Civil Rights Division has also obtained 13 indictments in other attacks or threats against people because of their religion. And we are not slowing down.

Three weeks ago, we obtained a jury verdict against a man who set fire to a mosque in Texas and a man from Missouri for threatening to kill members of a mosque.

Yesterday, we obtained a life sentence for a man who murdered an Indian-American man—a Sikh as it turned out—because he thought he was Muslim.

And in addition to protecting the safety of people of faith, we are also protecting them against unjust discrimination.

The Department of Justice has settled 24 civil cases with 90 plaintiffs regarding the previous administration's wrong application of the contraception mandate to objecting religious employers.

Earlier this year, a district court in Colorado issued a permanent injunction protecting the Little Sisters of the Poor from a government mandate that unnecessarily and unlawfully restricted their right to exercise their faith. In this case, the Department took the unusual step of formally switching sides in the case from the previous administration to successfully support the result that they sought.

In January, we filed a brief in a Montana court to defend parents who claim that the state barred their children from a private school scholarship program because they attend a religious school.

We also filed an amicus brief on behalf of the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C., which was refused advertising space for having a religious message.

And we filed supporting briefs in two ADF wins you may have been celebrating this week—Masterpiece Cake Shop and NIFLA.

We got involved in a lawsuit filed by ADF against Georgia Gwinnett College, a taxpayer-funded school that punished a student for sharing his faith outside of a designated "free speech zone."

How big was that free speech zone? Just 0.0015 percent of campus — and even inside the free speech zone, you need permission. Give me a break. It is exercise of religion and free speech.

There has been a lot to be proud of in the past year. But at the Department of Justice, we are taking steps to become even more effective for the years ahead.

In June, I announced the "Place to Worship" Initiative. Under this initiative, the Department of Justice is holding public events across America and improving training for federal prosecutors about legal protections for houses of worship.

That same day, we filed suit against a town in New Jersey for using zoning regulations to allegedly discriminate against an Orthodox Jewish congregation that tried for eight years without success to buy land for a synagogue.

In July, we filed a brief in federal court supporting the case of a Hindu temple in Maryland that claimed to have suffered discrimination in its attempts to purchase land.

Last Monday we held a religious liberty summit at the Department of Justice and I announced our next steps. I announced our new Religious Liberty Task Force.

More than 100,000 people tweeted about it. It was the third most tweetedabout topic on Earth at one point that day. Late-night comedians joked about it although 'joke' is a generous term for their doings.

Contrary to the elites and their "resistance," this task force is simply going to help us fully protect our religious freedoms that are preexisting, unalienable.

It will make sure that we practice what we preach by holding federal agencies accountable to federal law.

It will help us identify more cases that are right and just and deserve to be brought.

We intend to keep winning.

We will not be intimidated, of that you can be sure.

Under President Donald Trump, we are going to continue to uphold the Founders' tradition of religious liberty—and we will keep defending the rights of the American people.





Attorney General <u>Jeff Sessions</u> announced Monday that the Department of Justice is creating a "religious liberty task force."

Sessions said the task force, co-chaired by Associate Attorney General Jesse Panuccio and

the assistant attorney general for the Justice Department's Office of Legal Policy, Beth Williams, will help the department fully implement the religious liberty guidance it issued last year.

The guidance was a byproduct of <u>President Trump</u>'s executive order directing agencies to respect and protect religious liberty and political speech.

Sessions said on Monday that the task force will "ensure all Justice Department components are upholding that guidance in the cases they bring and defend, the arguments they make in court, the policies and regulations they adopt, and how we conduct our operations."

The announcement came during the department's religious liberty summit.

Sessions said the cultural climate in this country — and in the West more generally — has become less hospitable to people of faith in recent years, and as a result many Americans have felt their freedom to practice their faith has been under attack.

"We've seen nuns ordered to buy contraceptives. We've seen U.S. senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma—even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office. We've all seen the ordeal faced so bravely by Jack Phillips," he said, referring to the Colorado baker who took his case to the Supreme Court after he was found to have violated the state's anti-discrimination laws for refusing to make a cake for a same-sex wedding.

Sessions said the guidance he issued in October lays out 20 fundamental principles for the executive branch to follow, including the principles that free exercise means a right to act — or to abstain from action — and that government shouldn't impugn people's motives or beliefs.

"In short, we have not only the freedom to worship—but the right to exercise our faith. The Constitution's protections don't end at the parish parking lot nor can our freedoms be confined to our basements," he said, according to his prepared remarks.

Sessions said the federal government under the Trump administration is not just reacting but is actively seeking to accommodate people of faith.

"Religious Americans are no longer an afterthought," he said.

American culture has become "less hospitable to people of faith," Attorney General Jeff Sessions said Monday in vowing that the Justice Department would protect people's religious freedom and convictions.

Sessions spoke at a Justice Department summit on religious tolerance at a time when courts across the country have been asked how to balance anti-discrimination laws against the First Amendment's religious freedom guarantees.

Conservative groups immediately praised Sessions for promising to protect deeply held religious convictions, though Trump administration critics have repeatedly voiced concerns that the attorney general's stance undercuts LGBT rights and favors the rights of Christians over those of other faiths.

Sessions, the country's chief law enforcement officer, warned of a "dangerous movement" that he said was eroding protections for religious Americans.

He asserted that "nuns were being forced to buy contraceptives" — an apparent, though not fully accurate, reference to an Obama administration health care policy meant to ensure women covered by faith-based groups' health plans have access to cost-free contraceptives. Religious groups that challenged the policy argued it violated their religious beliefs.

Sessions also said it was inappropriate that judicial and executive branch nominees were being asked about their religious dogma. And he praised a Colorado baker who refused to make a cake for a same-sex couple in a case that reached the Supreme Court and ended in his favor. That baker, Jack Phillips, was part of a panel discussion at the Justice Department

#### summit.

"A dangerous movement, undetected by many, is now challenging and eroding our great tradition of religious freedom. There can be no doubt. This is no little matter. It must be confronted and defeated," Sessions said. "This election, and much that has flowed from it, gives us a rare opportunity to arrest these trends. Such a reversal will not just be done with electoral victories, but by intellectual victories."

Sessions, a Methodist and former Republican senator from Alabama, has made protecting religious liberty a cornerstone agenda item of his Justice Department — along with defending freedom of speech on college campuses.

In his speech, the attorney general noted that he had issued guidance last year advising executive branch employees on how to apply religious liberty protections in federal law.

Slate: Jeff Sessions Announces Religious Liberty Task Force at DOJ in Response to "Dangerous Movement" (Molly Olmstead)

Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced the creation of a Religious Liberty Task Force on Monday that will ensure that the Justice Department is prioritizing the rights of religious people and groups in its policies and legal battles by enforcing his "religious liberty" memo issued last fall.

Sessions told a crowd attending the Religious Liberty Summit at the Department of Justice headquarters that there was "a dangerous movement" eroding religious liberties and that "we have gotten to the point where courts have held that morality cannot be a basis for law; where ministers are fearful to affirm, as they understand it, holy writ from the pulpit; and where one group can actively target religious groups by labeling them a 'hate group' on the basis of their sincerely held religious beliefs."

He cited the legal challenge by <a href="the-Little Sisters of the Poor">the Poor</a> over its religious objections as a Catholic organization to paying for health insurance that covers contraception and the <a href="Masterpiece Cakeshop Supreme Court case">Masterpiece Cakeshop Supreme Court case</a> dealing with a baker who refused to make a wedding cake for a gay couple.

Sessions mentioned the Muslim, Jewish, and Hindu religions and proclaimed that the DOJ would protect all adherents from discrimination. But in arguing that it was an "unease" over a "changing cultural climate" that motivated Trump voters and the administration's religious-liberty policies, Sessions seemed to refer more to the complaints of the Christian right. "[Trump] said he respected people of faith and he promised to protect them in the free exercise of their faith," Sessions said. "He declared we would say 'Merry Christmas' again."

In October 2017, Sessions released a <u>vague memo</u> that instructed federal agencies to observe 20 "principles of religious liberty." Activists for LGBTQ and women's rights worried at the time that the proclamation gave broad permission for religious groups to ignore federal civil rights laws. But in reality, as <u>Slate's Mark Joseph Stern wrote months later</u>, Sessions did not seem to have the authority to undermine anti-discrimination laws, and the memo seemed to have no legal force behind it.

In Monday's announcement, Sessions said that the DOJ would work to ensure its employees "know their duties to accommodate people of faith" and put the 2017 memo into action. "Under this administration, the federal government is not just reacting—we are actively seeking, carefully, thoughtfully and lawfully, to accommodate people of faith," he said. "Religious Americans are no longer an afterthought."

Daily Beast: Jeff Sessions' 'Religious Liberty Task Force' Declares Holy War on LGBT People (Tim Teeman)

Sadly it is no exaggeration, no hyperbole, to say that Attorney General <u>Jeff</u>
Sessions declared a holy war on LGBT people, LGBT equality, and LGBT rights on Monday.

He declared war pretty much on anything that could be perceived to trespass on the 'religious freedom' or 'religious liberty' of Christians – which is a loosely defined

enough to be construed as trespassing on pretty much anything.

Sessions said this was because there was a "dangerous movement" to erode the Christian right to worship.

There isn't of course; it's an invented bogeyman for a ravenously-pursued ideological crusade. Women, religious minorities, LGBT people: prepare to fight for your bodies, your rights to worship, your wedding cakes.

Sessions' announcement of a "Religious Liberty Task Force" at a "Religious Liberty Summit" follows <u>President Trump's religious liberty executive order</u>of May. It also follows the Department of Health and Human Services' announcement in January of a new "Conscience and Religious Freedom Division" to be housed within the agency's Office for Civil Rights.

The "Religious Liberty Task Force" — which summons up images of a pirate ship filled with the staffs of the ADL, Liberty Counsel, and Family Research Council, sallying forth and liberating prejudiced bakers everywhere — will apparently ensure that everything Sessions laid out in his "religious liberty" memo of last October is pursued to the letter. That memo outlined how multiple government agencies should seek to uphold "religious liberty" even if it conflicts with existing anti-discrimination policies.

The "task force" will be co-chaired by Associate Attorney General Jesse Panuccio and the assistant attorney general for the Justice Department's Office of Legal Policy, Beth Williams.

But it is clearly Sessions who is behind it. And he appears intent to use the Department of Justice to advance this holy war, and wants to wage it against trespassers of 'religious liberty' across government departments.

The Trump administration is already winning in its battle to erode the few civil rights that LGBT people have. The Supreme Court, if the Trump administration has its way, will be replete with justices to rubberstamp whatever kind of discrimination it chooses to pursue. Loading the dice in this fundamental way apparently isn't enough for Jeff Sessions.

Today, at the "Religious Affairs Summit" held at the Department of Justice, he was not really talking about 'religious freedom' or 'religious liberty,' or any of the other soft-sounding codewords he and his ilk use. Sessions was talking about how the Government will support you as a Christian if you choose to discriminate against someone based on your religious beliefs.

If you are opposed to marriage equality or just dislike or disapprove of LGBT people generally, the Trump administration just gave you the green light to go ahead and refuse to serve them in your businesses, or help them with their medical care. If an LGBT person wants or needs to use your service, no problem – tell them to shove off. The Attorney General is right behind you.

Sessions, who made this announcement at an event attended by a host of groups whose business it is to foster discrimination against LGBT people, said openly on Monday how he and the administration supported the baker who refused to bake a wedding cake for a gay couple, and whose case went to the Supreme Court.

Let that sink in: the Attorney General of the United States just celebrated discrimination. Not only that, he said he wants to use his office – an office which is allegedly about ensuring justice for all – as a formal mechanism to allow this discrimination to happen more. He is being absolutely open about this.

"We've seen nuns ordered to buy contraceptives. We've seen U.S. senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma—even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office. We've all seen the ordeal faced so bravely by Jack Phillips," he said. (The right to discriminate against LGBT people is now "brave.")

The dogma jab was in reference perhaps to Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) who, at a Senate Judiciary Committee confirmation hearing for 7th Circuit Court of Appeals nominee Amy Coney Barrett last September, said the "dogma lives loudly within you," to the Catholic candidate. Or perhaps Sessions was referring to to Senator Cory Booker (D-N.J.), who not only skewered Sessions' appalling record on LGBT rights at his confirmation hearing, but also grilled Mike Pompeo at his Secretary of State hearing about whether he considered homosexuality to be "a perversion" as his previous comments had suggested.

Booker's question was not just well-asked, it was vitally relevant; as Secretary of State, part of Pompeo's job is focused around LGBT rights on a global stage, and America's part (or not) in helping to uphold them.

The real shame is that the Department of Justice has been co-opted to fight Sessions' faith wars against groups he so clearly despises.

Jeff Sessions was not speaking up for Christians, who have total freedom to worship whatever it is they want to. Instead, he framed himself and other Christians as the victims, which is ludicrous and shows just how weak their position is.

"Let's be frank," Sessions said. "A dangerous movement undetected by many is challenging and eroding our great tradition of religious freedom. There can be no doubt, it's no little matter, it must be confronted intellectually and politically and be defeated. This past election gives us a rare opportunity to arrest these trends and to confront them.

"We've gotten to the point where courts have held that morality cannot be a basis for law, where ministers are fearful to affirm holy writ from the pulpit, and where one group can actively target religious groups by labelling them hate groups," he added. "This President and Department of Justice are determined to protect and advance our heritage of freedom of religion."

Stripped back of its dime-store sermonizing, Sessions is talking about empowering the law to foster fear and loathing of – and discrimination against – LGBTQ people and other minorities.

"We have your back," he was telling future bakers who fear that their discrimination may, one day, land them in court. But he was also talking about the freedom to use religion to restrict a woman's right to choose; about using religion and faith as an instrument and weapon of the Department of Justice, when – surely – keeping both separate is vital to ensure equality for all citizens.

That is the most shocking gaslighting of Sessions' creepy speech and event. He is giving yet more power to abuse to the already powerful, while doing nothing to protect the already-imperiled rights of LGBT people, women, and religious minorities—which should be a cornerstone of his job as a public servant.

Sessions said the new task force would help "implement religious liberty guidance by ensuring all justice department components are upholding that guidance in cases they bring and defend, the arguments they make in court, the policies and regulations they adopt, and how we conduct our operations. That includes making sure our employees know their duties to accommodate people of faith."

Translated: the license to discriminate goes deep, and we will ensure it is followed to the letter.

Addressing his LGBT-hating compadres he continued, "As people in this room know, you have to practice what you preach, so we are going to remain in contact with religious groups across America to ensure their rights are being protected. This administration is animated by that same American view that has led us for 242 years, that every American has a right to believe and worship and exercise their faith in the public square."

But this isn't in question; of course people already have the right to worship. What 'religious freedom' and 'religious liberty' mean are totally different. It means seeking to restrict the freedoms and equality of those whose lives you, as a Christian person, disapprove of. That is not an exercise of faith. It is an exercise in discrimination.

"This approach has served this country well," Sessions said. "We are perhaps the most religiously developed nation in the world, and can take pride in respecting all people as they fully exercise their beliefs."

But if that was the case, Sessions and the DoJ would be supporting equality for all LGBT people when it came to accessing services and justice in the courts. But the "religious liberty task force" isn't in service for all; it's for entirely for one, already powerful group.

What is motivating Sessions in his crusade is fear; and it is not simply a fear of LGBT people and equality. It is a fear of how he and other Christians' feel their faith has been diminished, rejected, and impinged upon. Like much of the Trump agenda it feeds on those feeling aggrieved and embattled by a changing world.

LGBT people, and those damn feminists wanting control of their bodies, are convenient scapegoats when it comes to blame for why fewer people want to follow Christian teaching to the letter; and why 'holy writ' authority from the pulpit just isn't what it was.

"We must not let it depart from this noble tradition," Sessions said of our nation.

That's where this animus comes from, the 'task force' that will go out unto the land to insist on religious 'liberty' and 'freedom.' Sessions and his ilk feel 'their' nation—such an arrogant sense of ownership—is receding from them; becoming too varied and multiple, and so the bully losing the attention of the mob enlists a new, bespoke mob—a "Task Force" no less, to impose an old world order.

It's a frightening move, for sure, and one streaked with prejudice. It is a charter for discrimination, now sanctioned by the president, the legislative branch, and – if Trump and Sessions have their way – the courts. We can take a very small comfort that it also smacks of pathetic desperation.

The Trump administration has continued to prioritize religious freedom and emphasize its importance globally. Last week, Vice President Mike Pence made remarks to the contingent of foreign ministers at the State Department's ministerial on religious freedom, saying that America must continue to be the world's leader on this issue by ensuring domestic religious liberty first. "No one follows a hypocrite," he said.

Continuing this promise to protect our central freedom enshrined in the First Amendment, the Department of Justice on Monday held a Religious Liberty Summit, and Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced a new religious liberty task force.

"Freedom of religion has been a core American principle from the very beginning of our country — indeed, it is our 'first freedom.' President Trump promised that he would make preserving and protecting our religious liberty the first priority of his administration. The Department of Justice is committed to assisting with that effort," Sessions said. He remarked that in order to "institutionalize this process" and identify new opportunities to engage this important issue of religious freedom, the DOJ has established a religious liberty task force.

According to the memo obtained by Washington Examiner, the task force will "continue the department's ongoing work to protect and promote religious liberty." It will also consider new initiatives, including engaging in outreach to the public, religious liberty communities, and religious liberty organizations, and developing new strategies involving litigation, policy, and legislation, all with the goal of ensuring protection of this key, fundamental right.

Sessions will serve as chair of the task force. The summit at the DOJ on Monday includes a panel of legal and policy experts and a discussion titled "The Promise and Challenge of Religious Liberty." Jack Phillips of Masterpiece Cakeshop, who was involved in an important religious freedom case just decided by the Supreme Court last month, is scheduled for the panel.

In contrast to the previous administration, which did not value religious liberty either at home or abroad, the Trump administration's action should encourage all people of faith and belief systems. This particular emphasis and open commitment shows that religious freedom is a priority to the president. Everyone should appreciate that Trump and key Cabinet leaders are taking action to protect religious freedom.

As Secretary of State Mike Pompeo <u>said</u> at the religious freedom ministerial last week, "The United States advances religious freedom in our foreign policy because it is not exclusively an American right. It is a God-given universal right bestowed on all of mankind."

Attorney General Jeff Sesions launched a 'religious liberty task force' on Monday, suggesting the Justice Department wants more outcomes like the case of a Colorado baker who won a Supreme Court case after refusing to make a wedding cake for a same-sex couple.

Sessions said there is a 'dangerous' movement eroding a long history of resistance against political persecution that dates back to the Pilgrims in Massachusetts, Catholics in Maryland and Quakers in Pennsylvania, making America's dominant culture 'less hospitable to people of faith.'

In the process of announcing the move, he highlighted President <u>Donald Trump</u>'s frequent campaign promise to imspire a rebooted mainstreaming of the phrase 'Merry <u>Christmas</u>' in American life.

'We're going to say Merry Christmas again!' Trump said during several 2015 and 2016 rallies, always to wild applause from a largely Christian following.

Sessions said Monday that the president 'respected people of faith and he promised to protect them in the free exercise of their faith.'

'He declared we would say "Merry Christmas" again!' the attorney general insisted.

He was following up on Trump's 2017 executive order telling all federal agencies to protect religious liberty and other decisions of conscience in everything from commerce to political messaging.

The Masterpiece Cakeshop episode was top of mind, but not the only bee in the Justice Department's bonnet.

Sessions praised the Little Sisters of the Poor for resisting when bureaucrats overseeing the implementation of Obamacare refused to back down from requiring them to add coverage for birth control, forbidden by Catholic teaching, to their medical insurance plans.

He also railed against senators, largely Democrats, who have grilled Republican appointees about their beliefs.

'We've seen nuns ordered to buy contraceptives. We've seen U.S. senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma, even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office,' he said.

'We've all seen the ordeal faced so bravely by Jack Phillips,' sessions said, referring to the Colorado baker.

The state's civil rights commission initially found Philips guilty of violating antidiscrimination laws, but the Supreme Court ultimately ruled in his favor on procedural grounds.

Sessions alsothrow a subtle elbow at the Southern Poverty Law Center, a liberal watchdog group that has publicly classified some Christian advocacy groups as purveyors of hate speech.

In 2013 a gunman entered the lobby of the Family Research Council, one such group, and

opened fire. Floyd Corkins later said ne chose his target because the SPLC had branded it a hate-mongering anti-gay organization.

'We have gotten to the point ... where one group can actively target religious groups by labeling them a "hate group" on the basis of their sincerely held religious beliefs,' he complained.

The human Rights Campaign, a nationwide advocacy group for gays and lesbians, loudly condemned Sessions' move.

'This taxpayer funded task force is yet another example of the Trump-Pence White House and Jeff Sessions sanctioning discrimination against LGBTQ people,' said the group's legal director, Sarah Warbelow.

'Over the last 18 months, Donald Trump, Mike Pence and Jeff Sessions have engaged in a brazen campaign to erode and limit the rights of LGBTQ people in the name of religion.'

The <u>Justice Department</u> on Monday announced the formation of a Religious Liberty Task Force aimed at ensuring religious groups' protections when their beliefs conflict with government regulations.

In October, Attorney General Jeff Sessions issued a directive outlining a broad interpretation of religious freedom protections. It provided support for employers making hiring decisions based on their faith or objecting to providing health insurance for birth control.

The task force will follow up on that directive, Mr. Sessions said Monday. It will facilitate <u>Justice Department</u> compliance with the memo; facilitate coordination with it across government agencies; and reach out to religious organizations for feedback and develop new policies and strategies to protect religious freedoms.

If necessary, the task force will also review new lawsuits to protect religious freedoms, Mr. Sessions said.

"A dangerous movement, undetected by many, but real, is not challenging and eroding a great tradition of religious freedom," Mr. Sessions said announcing the task force. "There can be no doubt it's no little matter. It must be confronted intellectually and politically and defeated."

Mr. Sessions will chair the task force. Representatives from multiple <u>Justice</u>

<u>Department</u> components including the Civil Rights Division, Civil Division, Office of Legal Counsel and Office of Legal Policy will also participate.

Newser: Justice Department Creates 'Religious Liberty Task Force' (Evann Gastaldo)

Last year, President Trump signed an executive order on religious freedom, and now the Department of Justice is creating a "religious liberty task force" to implement the guidance that was issued as a result of that order. Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced the task force Monday during the DoJ's religious liberty summit, the Hill reports. Phillips won his case with a narrow ruling, stating his religious objections were not seriously and fairly considered by the Colorado Civil Rights Commission.

We've seen U.S. senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma — even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office," Sessions said, also referencing the <a href="Colorado baker who refused to bake">Colorado baker who refused to bake a wedding cake for a same-sex couple.</a>

Sessions says the task force will "help the Department fully implement our religious liberty

guidance," including "making sure our employees know their duties to accommodate people of faith."

The executive order that led to the creation of the task force states that "it shall be the policy of the executive branch to vigorously enforce Federal law's robust protections for religious freedom," as well as "respect and protect the freedom of persons and organizations to engage in religious and political speech."

Sessions issued a <u>new religious liberty guidance</u> in October that acted as a predecessor to this task force that said the freedom to exercise your chosen religion "includes the right to act or abstain from action in accordance with one's religious beliefs."

Sessions added on Monday that "religious Americans are no longer an afterthought" under the Trump administration. "In short, we have not only the freedom to worship — but the right to exercise our faith," he said. "The Constitution's protections don't end at the parish parking lot nor can our freedoms be confined to our basements."

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) responded to the announcement on Twitter with a reminder for the Justice Department:

"Reminder: Religious freedom protects our right to our beliefs, not a right to harm others. The Department of Justice has no business licensing discrimination against LGBT people, women, and religious minorities."

The Justice Department also announced a new "Place to Worship Initiative" just last month, seeking to protect religious institutions' ability to build, expand, buy, or rent facilities. Protecting religious liberties have been a consistent platform for the Trump administration, including siding with the baker who refused to serve a same-sex couple and religious organizations that refused to provide their employees with <u>insurance coverage for birth</u> control.

On Monday, Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced that the Justice Department has formed a task force to implement religious liberty guidance it introduced last year. Sessions made the announcement during a "Religious Liberty Summit" at Justice Department headquarters.

Indeed, Sessions specifically mentioned LGBTQ rights and reproductive rights in his announcement of the task force.

"We've seen U.S. senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma—even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office. We've all seen the ordeal faced so bravely by Jack Phillips."

Jack Phillips is the Colorado <u>cake artist</u> who told a same-sex couple he would not make them a wedding cake because it is against his religious beliefs in the U.S. Supreme Court case *Masterpiece Cakeshop v. Colorado Civil Rights Commission*. In his critique of senators' questions for judicial and executive branch nominees, Sessions may be referring to Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH) <u>questioning</u> then HUD Secretary nominee Ben Carson about whether

he supported LGBTQ rights or senators <u>asking</u> judicial nominee Wendy Vitter about her past anti-reproductive rights actions.

Phillips was present at the announcement Monday and was a panelist at the summit, which was backed by the Alliance Defending Freedom. The ADF has defended state-sanctioned sterilization of transgender people, supports a recriminalization of homosexuality in the United States, and has tried to link queer people to pedophilia, according to the Southern Poverty Law Center.

"The Attorney General standing shoulder-to-shoulder this morning with anti-LGBTQ extremists tells you everything you need to know about what today's announcement was really all about," Human Rights Campaign Legal Director Sarah Warbelow <u>said</u>in a statement on the organization's blog.

Kristen Clarke, president and executive director of the Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights Under Law, tweeted that the task force is for using "religion to mask their discriminatory goals."

DOJ should be working to fight discrimination and protect the rights of vulnerable communities. Instead, Jeff Sessions is launching a Religious Liberty Task Force to make it easier for people to use religion to mask their discriminatory goals. Shameful.

The guidance includes protections for businesses that discriminate by saying the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) of 1993 applied to businesses as well as people. This Justice Department guidance came after Trump issued an <u>executive order</u> in May 2017 for agencies to work on "promoting free speech and religious liberty." The order contained the words "deeply held beliefs" which <u>concerned</u> advocates in the LGBTQ community because they have also been used in bills that enable discrimination.

Sessions announced that the task force would be <u>co-chaired</u> by Jesse Panuccio, acting associate attorney general, who was a <u>lawyer</u> for supporters of Proposition 8, the California ban on same-sex marriage, and assistant attorney general for DOJ Office of Legal Policy, Beth Williams. Williams has <u>decried</u> "limitless injunctions" and "the dogged determination" with which she said they have "been employed against this President."

The Department of Health and Human Services recently created a new division within the Office for Civil Rights, called the Division of Conscience and Religious Freedom. This division was created to ensure health care providers don't have to provide services they object to morally or religiously. Roger Severino, who is in charge of the Office for Civil Rights, once said health care providers shouldn't have to help transgender people transition.

Sessions said the new task force will be co-chaired by the Associate Attorney General Jesse Panuccio and the Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Policy Beth Williams.

He explained that the task force will help the DOJ to "fully implement" religious liberty guidance issued in a memo last October that outlines 20 fundamental principles for the Executive Branch to follow so they can properly apply religious liberty protections in federal law.

That guidance arose out of President Trump's executive order last May directing agencies to respect and protect religious liberty.

Sessions said that this new task force will help implement the DOJ's guidance by "ensuring that all Justice Department components are upholding that guidance in the cases they bring and defend, the arguments they make in court, the policies and regulations they adopt, and how we conduct our operations."

"That includes making sure that our employees know their duties to accommodate people

of faith," he added.

Sessions emphasized the importance of practicing "what you preach," saying the DOJ will be remaining "in contact with religious groups across America to ensure that their rights are being protected."

"We have been holding listening sessions and we will continue to host them in the coming weeks," he said.

Prior to his announcement, Sessions said that he believed a "dangerous movement, undetected by many, is now challenging and eroding our great tradition of religious freedom."

"This election, and much that has flowed from it, gives us a rare opportunity to arrest these trends," he said, adding that, "such a reversal will not just be done with electoral victories, but by intellectual victories."

Sessions said that, in recent years, "many Americans have felt that their freedom to practice their faith has been under attack."

"And it's easy to see why. We've seen nuns ordered to buy contraceptives," he said, referencing the Little Sisters of the Poor's legal fight against the Obama-era HHS mandate.

"We've seen U.S. Senators ask judicial and executive branch nominees about dogma—even though the Constitution explicitly forbids a religious test for public office," he continued, referencing incidents like Sen. Dianne Feinstein's grilling of then-judicial nominee Amy Coney Barrett about her Catholic faith. At the hearing, Feinstein said the "dogma lives loudly within" Barrett and that was "of concern."

"We've all seen the ordeal faced so bravely by Jack Phillips," Sessions added.

Phillips, a baker who objected for religious reasons to bake a cake for a same-sex wedding in a case that went <u>all the way</u> to the U.S. Supreme Court, appeared in a panel following the Attorney General's remarks.

Sessions argued that President Trump heard the concern that arose from cases like these and that was one reason he won the 2016 election.

"I believe this unease is one reason that he was elected," he said. "In substance, he said he respected people of faith and he promised to protect them in the free exercise of their faith.

"He declared we would say 'Merry Christmas' again," Sessions added, generating some laughter from the audience.

"Under this administration, the federal government is not just reacting—we are actively seeking, carefully, thoughtfully and lawfully, to accommodate people of faith," Sessions emphasized. "Religious Americans are no longer an afterthought."

The new task force represents a continued push by federal agencies under the Trump Administration to actively protect religious freedom. PJ Media: Jack Phillips Opens Up About Being Compared to a Nazi, Though His Dad Liberated a Concentration Camp (Tyler O'Neil)

On Monday, Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced a new Religious Liberty Task Force at the Department of Justice (DOJ). To help explain the necessity of this new task force, the DOJ hosted a panel of advocates for religious freedom, including Jack Phillips, the baker in the Supreme Court case Masterpiece Cakeshop v. Colorado Civil Rights Commission.

In that case, the <u>Supreme Court ruled</u> that the commission had displayed "clear and impermissible hostility" to Phillips' religious beliefs. Phillips had refused to bake a cake to

celebrate a same-sex wedding, and the commission ruled that he had discriminated against the gay couple on the basis of sexual orientation. In one telling exchange, a member of the commission compared Phillips' denial of service to those who defend the Holocaust.

On Monday, Phillips shared his personal experience with the Holocaust — his father fought in World War II and served with one of the first battalions to liberate a concentration camp.

In 2014, the Colorado commissioner declared that "freedom of religion and religion has been used to justify all kinds of discrimination throughout history, whether it be slavery, whether it be the holocaust, whether it be — I mean, we — we can list hundreds of situations where freedom of religion has been used to justify discrimination. And to me it is one of the most despicable pieces of rhetoric that people can use to — to use their religion to hurt others."

This declaration was more than just offensive. First, Phillips made key business decisions based on his religious beliefs that cost him key revenues. Not only does his shop close on Sundays, but he has refused to bake Halloween cakes — and Halloween is the third biggest time for demand in the cake business.

On Friday, Phillips revealed that he would not bake "anti-American cakes or cakes that would disparage people in any way, including people who identify as LGBT." His opposition to baking products that would endorse messages he disagrees with is the furthest thing from twisting religion to justify discrimination against LGBT people.

Kerri Kupec, a staffer with the DOJ Office of Public Affairs, asked Phillips to recount his feelings at being accused of "despicable rhetoric" like justifying the holocaust.

"I was surprised. It was stunningly insulting, really," Phillips said. He noted that he offered to sell the same-sex couple "anything in my shop. It doesn't matter what your orientation is, I just can't do this cake."

"For the commission to compare that decision to not violate my faith to especially the Holocaust was personally insulting because my father served in World War II," the baker revealed.

His father "landed in Normandy, he crossed France and Germany, he got a Purple Heart because of a mortar attack — which sent him back to England, patched him up, sent him tack to combat in Germany. He finished the war there," Phillips recalled.

"But he also was part of a group that liberated one of the concentration camps, the Buchenwald concentration camp," the baker added. "And for this commissioner to compare the decision not to bake the cake portraying this message that was so antithetical to my belief about marriage, comparing that to the Holocaust, it was just such an insult."

Phillips won his case, but others face similar situations what may not be quite as clear cut. Religious business owners should be able to refuse service to events that violate their convictions, but some LGBT activists have declared their intent to "punish the wicked," to keep these people from being able to opt out of serving same-sex weddings.

If Colorado commissioners will compare the son of a Purple Heart World War II veteran who liberated a concentration camp to defenders of the Holocaust, there is no depth to which activists will not sink in opposing religious freedom.

Freedom of religion has been a core American principle from the very beginning of our country—indeed, it is our "first freedom." President Trump promised that he would make preserving and protecting our religious liberty the first priority of his administration. The Department of Justice is committed to assisting with that effort.

On October 6, 2017, I issued a *Memorandum to All Executive Departments and Agencies on Federal Law Protections for Religious Liberty* (the "Religious Liberty Memorandum"). This Religious Liberty Memorandum, which the President directed me to issue in Executive Order 13798, explained twenty key principles of religious liberty in U.S. law, and provided direction to agencies in four areas: agencies as employers, rulemaking, enforcement actions, and contracting or grant-making.

The same day, I also issued a memorandum within the Department of Justice instructing components on how to implement the Religious Liberty Memorandum (the "implementation memorandum"). This implementation memorandum called on components to incorporate the Religious Liberty Memorandum in all aspects of the Department's litigation, in advice to other agencies, in Department operations, and through its own rulemaking and its interagency rule review. The implementation memorandum required components to notify the Associate Attorney General of all issues that arise which implicate the Religious Liberty Memorandum. It assigned to the Office of Legal Policy the responsibility to review every Department rulemaking or other agency action submitted for Department review by the Office of Management and Budget to ensure its consistency with the Religious Liberty Memorandum, and it designated the Office of Legal Policy as the point of contact for any questions about either document.

Since the issuance of the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum, the Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy have together coordinated the Department's compliance with both memoranda. The Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy also have worked collaboratively with staff from several other components, drawing on their expertise in this area to ensure compliance with the memoranda and to identify additional opportunities to protect and promote religious liberty.

In order to institutionalize this process, and to leverage the expertise and experience of diverse components within the Department to identify new opportunities for the Department to engage with the issue of religious liberty, today I have established a Religious Liberty Task Force (the Task Force). I will serve as Chair of the Task Force, with the Associate Attorney General serving as Vice Chair for Litigation and the Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Policy serving as Vice Chair for Policy. The Task Force will be further composed of representatives from the Office of the Deputy Attorney General, the Civil Division, the Civil Rights Division, the Environment and Natural Resources Division, the Office of Legal Counsel, the Office of Legal Policy, the Office of Public Affairs, a U.S. Attorney's Office that I will designate, and other components that I may designate from time to time to aid in the Task Force's work.

The Religious Liberty Task Force will continue the Department's ongoing work to implement the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum. The Task Force will also consider new initiatives that will further the Department's work to protect and promote religious liberty. To that end, the Task Force will: 1) facilitate Department component compliance with the memoranda; 2) address novel, recurring, or cross-cutting issues in the Department's work implicating the memoranda; 3) facilitate interagency coordination regarding the Religious Liberty Memorandum; 4) engage in outreach to the public, religious communities, and religious liberty organizations to obtain feedback on compliance with the Religious Liberty Memorandum; and 5) develop new strategies, involving litigation, policy, and legislation, to protect and promote religious liberty.



This implementation memorandum called on components to incorporate the Religious Liberty Memorandum in all aspects of the Department's litigation, in advice to other agencies, in Department operations, and through its own rulemaking and its interagency rule review. The implementation memorandum required components to notify the Associate Attorney General of all issues that arise which implicate the Religious Liberty Memorandum. It assigned to the Office of Legal Policy the responsibility to review every Department rulemaking or other agency action submitted for Department review by the Office of Management and Budget to ensure its consistency with the Religious Liberty Memorandum, and it (like the Religious Liberty Memorandum) designated OLP as the point of contact for any questions about either document.

Since the issuance of the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum, the Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy have together coordinated the Department's compliance with both memoranda. The Associate Attorney General's office and the Office of Legal Policy also have worked collaboratively with staff from several other components, drawing on their expertise in this area to ensure compliance with the memoranda and to identify additional opportunities to protect and promote religious liberty.

In order to institutionalize this process, and to leverage the expertise and experience of diverse components within the Department to identify new opportunities for the Department to engage with the issue of religious liberty, today I have established a Religious Liberty Task Force. I will serve as Chair of the Task Force, with the Associate Attorney General serving as Vice Chair for Litigation and the Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Policy serving as Vice Chair for Policy. The task force will be further composed of representatives from the Office of the Deputy Attorney General, the Civil Division, the Civil Rights Division, the Environment and Natural Resources Division, the Office of Legal Counsel, the Office of Legal Policy, the Office of Public Affairs, a U.S. Attorney's Office that I will designate, and other components that I may designate from time to time to aid in the Task Force's work.

The Religious Liberty Task Force will continue the Department's ongoing work to implement the Religious Liberty Memorandum and the implementation memorandum. The Task Force will also consider new initiatives that will further the Department's work to protect and promote religious liberty. To that end, the Task Force will: 1) facilitate Department component compliance with the memoranda; 2) address novel, recurring, or cross-cutting issues in the Department's work implicating the memoranda; 3) facilitate interagency coordination regarding the Religious Liberty Memorandum; 4) engage in outreach to the public, religious communities, and religious liberty organizations to obtain feedback on compliance with the Religious Liberty Memorandum; and 5) develop new strategies, involving litigation, policy, and legislation, to protect and promote religious liberty.







Dear Mr. Attorney General:

As you know, the American Center for Law & Justice (ACLJ) is a non-profit law firm dedicated to the defense of constitutional liberties secured by law. ACLJ attorneys have argued before the Supreme Court of the United States in a number of significant cases involving the freedoms of speech and religion. The ACLJ and its international affiliates are also dedicated to defending human rights around the world. Therefore, we are writing you today regarding the lack of a formal definition of "persecution" in the Immigration and Nationality Act.

## Background

Currently, aliens seeking asylum in the United States are required to establish that they are refugees meaning that they (1) suffered persecution, or (2) have a well-founded fear of persecution. However, certain terms, such as "persecution," have not been defined, and therefore their meaning is determined by the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA). This has led to a case-by-case interpretation of the meaning of "persecution," and has led to a circuit split regarding the term and what it encompasses.

#### **Facts**

According to 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(42)(A), an alien seeking asylum has "the burden of establishing, by a preponderance of the evidence, that they are [a] 'refugee[]' under the INA's definition of this term" by "showing that they (1) have suffered persecution, or (2) have a well-founded fear of persecution (3) on account of (4) a protected ground (i.e., race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in a particular social group)." However, "[t]he term 'persecution' is not defined in the Immigration and Nationality Act," *Balazoski v. INS*, 932 F.2d 638, 641-42 (7th Cir. 1991), and "is not established by Convention or Protocol, or by the INA and its implementing regulations. Instead, [its] meaning has been determined by the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) the highest administrative tribunal for interpreting and applying immigration law through case-by-case adjudication, with the federal courts generally deferring to the BIA's interpretation so long as it is based on a 'permissible construction' of the INA."

On the other hand, the executive branch has interpreted the term "well-founded fear" through the promulgation of regulations: "These regulatory interpretations are also afforded deference by the courts insofar as they are based on 'permissible' constructions of the statutory language." Asylum applicants can demonstrate a well-founded fear of persecution if: (A) they have a fear of persecution in their country; (B) there is a reasonable possibility of suffering such persecution; and (C) they are unable or unwilling to return to that country because of such fear. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 1208.13(b)(2)(i).

Accordingly, while "well-founded fear" has been defined, whether an alien is seeking to establish that they have suffered persecution, or that they have a well-founded fear of experiencing persecution if they return to their country, that alien faces the challenge of meeting a currently subjective standard of defining "persecution."

According to 8 U.S.C. § 1103(g)(1)-(2) "[t]he Attorney General shall have such authorities and functions under this chapter and all other laws relating to the immigration and naturalization of aliens," and "shall establish such regulations, . . . issue such instructions, review such administrative determinations in immigration proceedings . . . and perform such other acts as the Attorney General determines to be necessary for carrying out this section." Moreover, the "determination and ruling by the Attorney General with respect to all questions of law shall be controlling." 8. U.S.C. § 1103(a)(1). Thus, it is within the Attorney General's power to establish by regulation, instruction, or review of administrative determination, a definition of "persecution" in order to resolve the current circuit split and the subjective nature of the way in which current interpretations are established.

## **Issue**

In 2016, a panel of Tenth Circuit judges, upheld a BIA decision that denied a Chinese Christian's petition for asylum. In that case, Ting Xue, a Chinese citizen, was arrested when Chinese authorities raided an illegal house church service which Xue was attending. During interrogation, Xue was questioned, slapped across the head, and hit with a baton on his upper left arm. After his interrogation, Xue was placed in a small jail cell with four other men who were arrested during the raid. "The five men shared a single wooden bucket for a toilet," which was not

emptied during the three days and four nights of Xue's incarceration. Upon Xue's release, which was procured when his mother paid a significant fine, Xue was "forced to sign a document guaranteeing he would not attend any more illegal church meetings. Officers warned Xue that if he ever again attended services at a house church, he would be severely punished." Following his release, "Xue was required to report to the police station once every week and remain for one hour. During these weekly sessions, officers would ask Xue about his whereabouts during the week, tell him he should be patriotic and faithful to his job, and force him to write down his personal feelings about his reeducation."

Despite finding Xue's testimony credible, including the facts that Xue was arrested for attending a Christian church, assaulted while in police custody, required to pay a fine for his release, forced to sign a paper saying he would not attend Christian services, required to attend weekly "reeducation," and told that if he did attend Christian church services he would be severely punished, the BIA found, and the Tenth Circuit affirmed its finding, that Xue did not experience persecution. Nor did he "demonstrate that he face[d] a particularized threat of persecution should he return to China." Rather, "[a]s the BIA explained, Xue testified that he [secretly] returned to the underground church two weeks after being released, and did not demonstrate that the reporting requirement was onerous or that he suffered other harm." Such reasoning effectively, allows for freedom of religious belief, but does *not* allow freedom to *exercise* that religious belief; persecution can occur only when a religious adherent *openly* practices his religious belief.

In contrast, the Seventh, Ninth, and Eleventh Circuits have adopted a definition of persecution in which it is a "clear error of law," to hold "that one is not entitled to claim asylum on the basis of religious persecution if . . . one can escape the notice of the persecutors by concealing one's religion." In fact, the Seventh Circuit went on to note that "Christians living in the Roman Empire before Constantine made Christianity the empire's official religion faced little risk of being thrown to the lions if they practiced their religion in secret; it doesn't follow that Rome did not persecute Christians, or that a Christian who failed to conceal his faith would be acting 'unreasonably.' . . . One aim of persecuting a religion is to drive its adherents underground in the hope that their beliefs will not infect the remaining population." Similarly, the Eleventh Circuit stated that it "agree[d] with the decision of the Seventh Circuit that having to practice religion underground to avoid punishment is itself a form of persecution."

## Conclusion

Immigration (asylum) law is complex and requires a great deal of fact finding. Defining legal terms to clarify standards for facts finders is within the purview of the Attorney General, as it is directly related to his authority under U.S. law to administer and enforce laws relating to the immigration and naturalization of aliens. As has been demonstrated by the split in the circuits regarding what constitutes "persecution," there is a need for a concrete and correct definition of persecution to ensure that immigration and naturalization laws are uniformly applied to asylum seekers.

Freedom of religion, and the right to freely exercise that religion, has always been valued in the United States. It is a foundational right. Thus, it is important that the United States recognize that

a prohibition that forces a person to secretly practice their faith or face imprisonment, physical abuse, state reeducation and indoctrination, and fines is a form of persecution.

Therefore, we respectfully request that you exercise the power granted to you under 8 U.S.C. § 1103 and direct the adoption of a definition of "persecution" that aligns with the Seventh, Ninth, and Eleventh Circuit definitions, which recognize government restriction that forces a person to conceal their faith and practice in secret is itself a form of persecution.

## ATTORNEY GENERAL ISSUES RELIGIOUS FREEDOM DAY PROCLAMATION

Attorney General Jeff Sessions released the following proclamation commemorating Religious Freedom Day:

"Thomas Jefferson served as President for two terms, as Vice President, and as Secretary of State, but he did not mention these prestigious titles on his tombstone. Instead, he named three accomplishments he was more proud of that he had founded the University of Virginia, authored the Declaration of Independence, and authored the Virginia statute of religious freedom.

To commemorate Religious Freedom Day, the Department of Justice will: file an amicus brief today supporting reversal of the D.C. District Court's decision denying the Archdiocese of Washington's motion for preliminary injunction against Washington Area Metropolitan Transit Authority (WMATA); update the United States Attorney's Manual (USAM) with Associate Attorney General's Approval and Notice Requirements for Issues Implicating Religious Liberty and direct United States Attorneys' Offices to appoint a Religious Liberty Coordinator; and file an amicus brief later this week with the Supreme Court of Montana supporting parents who claim that the state unconstitutionally discriminated against their children when it barred them from a private school scholarship program because they attend a religious school.

On this Religious Freedom Day, as we remember this historic statute, we do well to remember the timeless truths it articulates: that religious freedom is an inalienable human right which deserves the protection of the law and that 'truth is great and will prevail if left to herself.'
