Grant Funding

Providing or Enhancing Population Specific Outreach and Services to Adult and Youth Victims

Awards Range of \$550,000-\$625,000

Deaf focused projects will receive an additional \$25,000 for communication access and accommodations

\$9 million= 15 awards

36 months



Purpose Areas

- Working with State, local, federal, territory, government AND organizations
- Strengthen Capacity of traditional victim service providers to Provide Population Specific Services
- Work in Cooperation with Underserved to Develop and Implement Outreach, Education, Prevention or Intervention strategies, resources, & specific issues faced by victims FROM Underserved Populations

- Strengthen Capacity of Underserved Population to Provide Population Specific Services
- Strengthen Effectiveness of criminal and civil justice interventions by providing training to certain CJ entities.
- Provide population specific training to social and human service providers.



Population Specific Services and Underserved Populations- What Does That Mean?

Population Specific Services: Victim centered services that address the safety, health, economic, legal, housing, workplace, immigration, confidentiality, or other needs of victims AND services are designed primarily for and are targeted to a specific underserved populations

Underserved Populations: Populations who face barriers in **accessing AND using** victim services



OVW Priority Area

Strengthen efforts to **prevent and end** sexual assault **victim services** and civil and criminal justice **responses**.

To Be Eligible for Priority Area: Focus 100% on Sexual Assault Emphasis on Non-IPV

This Includes

Adult Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse

Address Priority Area AND Meet Criteria= Application Special Consideration

STRONGLY encouraged, but **NOT** required to address.

Non-Profit, Non-Governmental Organizations



The 5 Categories

- Deaf Programs
- LGBT Organizations
- Organizations Serving Underserved Religious Populations
- Disability Programs
- Organizations Serving Certain Underserved Racial and Ethnic Populations

New Applicants or Continuation Applicants

FY 22 and FY 23 Award Recipients are not eligible to apply (as lead OR partner)

MUST demonstrate **HOW** your organization **meets** the eligibility definition for **ONE** of the categories

MUST be a victim service provider **OR MUST** partner with a victim service provider.



Partnerships

AT LEAST ONE IS REQUIRED



Partnership Type 1

The applicant must partner with any type of organization if the applicant has at least three years of demonstrated **experience and expertise** in **providing direct services** to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking from the targeted underserved community.





Partnership Type 2

Applicant must partner with a victim service provider if the applicant has fewer than three years of demonstrated experience and expertise in providing direct services to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking from the targeted underserved community.



Partnership Type 3

If the applicant is a Disability program, the applicant must be the nonprofit, nongovernmental organization serving people with disabilities and/or Deaf individuals, and the partners from the previous Disability Grant Program award must be involved with the project.

Program Narrative



Narrative Section

- Three sections must be completed.
- Different questions than previous solicitations
- Important to complete all questions in each section.

WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHY, HOW of project

Address the barriers underserved specific populations face

Projects need to ensure survivors from underserved specific populations are centered, leading, or involved in the project.

Applicant is **required** to **demonstrate** how they **meet** the **eligibility criteria.**



Important address the intersectionality serving underserved populations.

IRS three-step safe-harbor procedure— Executive Compensation —

Sample Disclosure Letter

Address all four parts



Pre-Award Risk Assessment (questionnaire)

Eleven questions; Multiple parts to each question

Most Common issues:

- Brief list of policies and procedures not provided
- Budgeted vs. Actual process not provided
- Record Retention policy not provided
- Knowledge of rules and regulations

All applicants **MUST** register online with **SAM** and **Grants.gov**

Encourage you to **complete ASAP.** This process **can take several weeks**. DON'T WAIT!

If your organization has technical difficulties, maintain all correspondence.



Important Things To Know (continued)

Applications **submission** is a **TWO-STEP process**.

Submit the **SF424 and SF LLL** in Grants.Gov (submit no later than 48 hrs before deadline)

Submit **application and** attachments in the **Just Grants System**
