
Personnel:

Resources:

The Fiscal Year 2019 budget proposes to merge the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services into the Office of Justice Programs. This will allow the Department of Justice to centralize and strengthen the partnerships it has with its colleagues in State and local law enforcement and will help to promote community policing not only through the hiring program but also through the advancement of strategies for policing innovations and other crime-fighting techniques. The FY 2019 Budget also proposes to move the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) Methamphetamine Lab Cleanup Program to the DEA Salaries and Expenses account to centralize DEA's funding streams dedicated to assisting State and local law enforcement in their communities.
