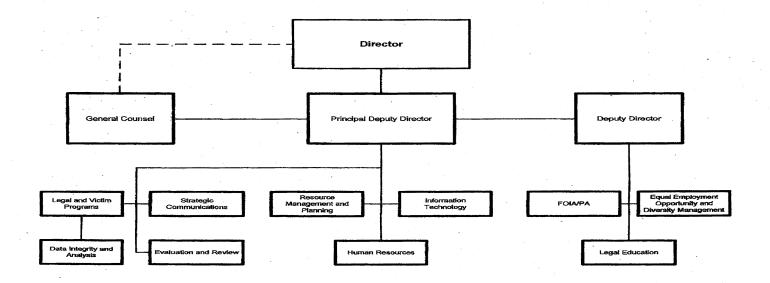

For FY 2019, the obligations reflect the updated number based on revised financials.

#### Reprogramming/Transfers:

In FY 2019, \$11,637 was transferred into the United States Attorneys Salaries and Expenses account; \$11,000 from prior year unobligated balances to the no-year direct account and \$637 from ONDCP-HIDTA to the multiyear account.

#### Carryover:

The United States Attorneys carried a direct unobligated balance of \$45,315 into FY 2019. The amount came from these sources: (1) \$14,249 is from the no-year salaries and expenses account; (2) \$9,401 from the no-year HCFAC account; (3) \$21,000 from the multiyear account for HCFAC; and (4) \$665 from the multiyear account for ONDCP-HIDTA.

#### Recoveries/Refunds:

A total of \$57,940 was recovered and collected in direct funds in FY 2019. The \$1,089 in recoveries from prior year obligations were made up of: (1) \$495 in the no-year salaries and expenses account and (2) \$594 in the no-year HCFAC account. Also in FY 2019, \$56,850 was collected in direct collections all of which are HCFAC; \$29,851 from no-year and \$27,000 from multi-year HCFAC.

#### Carryover:

The United States Attorneys carried a direct unobligated balance of \$43,615K into FY 2020. The amount came from these sources: (1) \$20,333K from the no-year salaries and expenses account; (2) \$7,417K from the no-year HCFAC account; (3) \$15,275K from the multiyear account for HCFAC; and (4) \$590K from the multiyear account for ONDCP-HIDTA.
