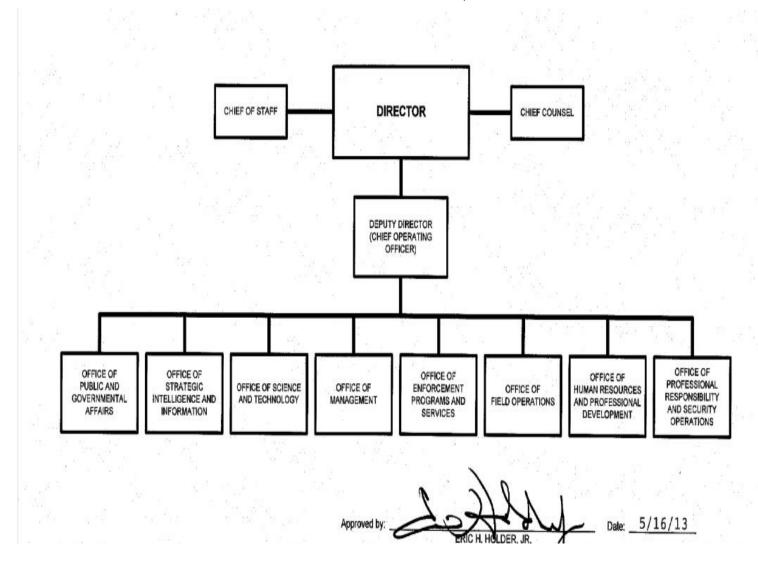
## **Organizational Chart**

As a result of the AWS-3 auction that ended in January 2015, the Department's Law Enforcement components—ATF, DEA, FBI, and USMS—were required to move off of their current 1755-1780 MHz locations that were used for video surveillance and other functions. To facilitate this move, the Department received \$1.1 billion from the proceeds of the AWS-3 auction. While these funds will support the transition off of the affected spectrum, they will not support the ongoing O&M required for the new equipment. As the transition is expected to stretch through the BY 2025, ATBs are anticipated to be requested through BY 2026.
